Speaker: Francisco Miranda

Topic: The Genus Laelia in Brazil

A taxonomist, naturalist and orchid grower, Francisco travels extensively in the U.S. and internationally speaking at orchid-related events and meetings. He has been doing this since 1988, while still living in Brazil. Francisco and his family moved to Florida in 1999.

Francisco has traveled extensively to study orchids in their natural environments.

Miranda Orchids started in 1999. Many of the plants available are produced in their lab and nursery in Central Florida from their extensive collection of plants. The rest they bring from Brazil to increase variety and novelty.

Miranda Orchids is located between Orlando and Tampa, on the I-4 Central Florida corridor. Access the nursery by I-27 south from I-4 or from I-4 exit 48 south. They are about 4 miles in a straight line south of I-4.

Francisco will educate us about the many Laelia orchids that hail from Brazil.

From Our President

Hello Orchid Lovers and Happy July 4th!

Summer has begun with a lot of rainy days that put a strain on us and our orchids. We must be vigilant in checking for fungus infections and pests that would adversely affect the health of our orchids.

Hurricane season began June 1. If this year is anything like last year, we will be bringing our orchids into the house to protect the plants from the effects of a hurricane. Finding a safe place to hang or store them inside temporarily can be difficult. Remember to water well and drain, then treat for pests before bringing in the plants. If you cannot bring all your orchids indoors, leave nothing hanging in the wind. Placing on concrete is preferred to placing directly on the ground where flooding and pathogens might contact your plants. You may wish to treat your plants with a fungicide after a hurricane, because the storms are known to bring many fungal diseases. If your trees have lost branches after a storm, and too much sunlight becomes a problem for the orchids you have growing in trees, you may prevent sunburn by cutting a length of screening or shade cloth and hanging it between the orchid and the sunlight. Spanish moss draped around the plants can also be helpful. In addition to shielding the plants from sunlight, the moss helps hold moisture when draped around the orchid's roots.

We appreciate all our members - both old and new. This is your Society. We hope that you enjoy the meetings and activities. If you have any suggestions, we would like to hear them. Thanks to all of you!

Tasks for July

by Dr. Martin Motes

- Dry plants hard once or twice
- Apply liquid fertilizer instead of water during dry patches.
- Watch for Thrips when rain has been sparse for several days.
- Finish top cutting and planting of Vandaceous genera
- Check the spacing of plants on benches to allow sufficient room for the bases of the plants to receive both air and light.
- Now is a good time to trim those trees on which orchids are mounted or hung. Removing vertical branches will permit the light our orchids need to enter and will also insure that the tree has less wind resistance in the event of a storm.
- Be especially careful with watering and relish every opportunity to dry our orchids out.

Did You Know...

- Orchids are the largest family of angiosperms (flowering plants).
- ◆ There are more than 25,000 documented orchid species throughout the world.
- The smallest orchid, Campylocentrum insulare, is just 2.1mm wide. The petals are so thin that they are
 just one cell thick and transparent.
- Orchids have the tiniest seeds in the world; there can be up to 3 million seeds in an orchid seed pod.
- Some orchid flowers last for a few hours, while others last for months.
- Some orchid plants have lived 100 years or more.
- In 1909 it was discovered that certain fungi are important for the germination of orchid seeds. The symbiotic relationship between fungus and a root is known as a mycorrhiza, which literally means fungus -root.
