Dr. Jason Downing, Orchid Biologist from the Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden (Fairchild) will inform us about Fairchild's project to reintroduce Florida's rare and endangered native orchids into South Florida's environments. With the help of thousands of students from local schools, Fairchild has been generating large quantities of these orchid plants from seed. They are now propagating with the goal to reestablish them within South Florida's public landscapes, around schools, on street trees, and in city parks. The Million Orchid Project is unique in its scale, its exclusive focus on public landscapes, and its involvement of the local community throughout the entire growing process. At its core, The Million Orchid Project is a massive science experiment that allows Fairchild Garden to make important discoveries about how native orchids grow and reproduce. Additionally, the techniques used through The Million Orchid Project may help them develop more general strategies for rescuing rare plants within a highly developed and rapidly changing urban environment.

The Boca Raton Orchid Society has supported this project for the past few years.

The Boca Raton Orchid Society supports and sponsors the After School Orchid Program at JC Mitchel and Addison Mizner Elementary Schools, grades 3-5. The program exists as part of our focus on education. It is exciting to teach the next generation of orchid enthusiasts. The Program meets once a month.

During the month of September, students were introduced to orchids and other green plants. They learned about the importance of green plants, plant parts and their functions.

In October, we zoomed in on orchids. They learned about different types, where they grow (everywhere except Antarctica), what they need to grow, such as optimal temperatures and lighting, watering, and different types of media; examples of media include fir bark, expanded clay pellets, and coconut fiber.


We had a rapt audience who were disappointed we wouldn't be meeting every day!!

Eventually each participant will be given a Phalaenopsis orchid that will be in spike. Students will be responsible for the care of their plant and should soon be rewarded with beautiful blooms.



Tasks for November

The incredible heat and relative drought of September has been followed by an extraordinarily wet October. The growing season has been extended by two to three weeks for many genera. Callista dendrobiums(lindleyi, farmerii, etc.) which would normally have started their dormant cycle are pushing another set of new growths. These should be fed and encouraged for the next week or two that they need to mature. For the other genera and other sections of Dendrobium which should have been starting to rest two weeks ago, the dry season cannot arrive too soon. Dry all the plants that have completed their growths as quickly and as thoroughly as possible. Even Vandas which have loved the extra heat and moisture should be watered judiciously. Days are shorter now, and temperatures are lower. Both these factors reduce drying potential markedly. Remember, too, that the exceptionally warm and humid tropical air which surrounds us still holds the potential to be tapped once more for torrential rains with the arrival of the next cold front. Until the dry season is definitely established care in watering and vigilance in scouting for disease problems is warranted.

Protecting our tender plants from exposure to wind must be our primary concern in preparing them for winter. Buildings, walls and even thick hedges can be very effective windbreaks slowing or stopping chill air. Choose places in your garden that offer this sort of protection to your orchid plants wherever possible.

Orchids that are grown in shade houses, in patios or pool enclosures can be protected by installing plastic film on the north and west walls of the structure.

Healthy, well-nourished plants withstand cold better as do plants that are harder and not too lushly in growth. Because both light and temperature are lower in November and most orchids have slowed their growth, they need less fertilizer.
